Overcoming difficult times

- Government and community found away to agree on cultural and scientific methods around the impacts of the cultural Heritage.
- It took a lot of government to sit listen and build a trustworthy relationship with the Aboriginal community
- Solutions were reach as they developed a cultural heritage officer role to be located at the lake Victoria to report on the issues that impact Cultural heritage. Then later empoyed two traineeships and a Lake Victoria Project officer.






Achievement for community governments

- Community are spending more time on country after the strengthening relationships with MDBA, SA Water and NSW Water in big Lake Area.
